1. Marine Engineering

What to do after 12th?

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139. Neuroprosthetics Engineer (Bionic Limb Programmer)

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140. Zero-Waste Supply Chain Architect

What to do after 12th?

Formal degrees are not required. A background in gymnastics or skydiving is helpful. You must undergo rigorous, specialized physical training and certification directly from the wind tunnel company (like iFLY).



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143. Off-Grid Living Consultant

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148. Biomimetic Robotics Engineer

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150. Volumetric Video Producer (Hologram Director)

Description:

A Volumetric Video Producer directs actors inside a massive “capture dome” surrounded by hundreds of inward-facing cameras. Instead of filming a flat 2D video, they capture the actor in complete, 360-degree 3D. The resulting “volumetric” footage allows a viewer wearing a VR headset to literally walk entirely around the actor as they perform a scene. The “Why” is “The Next Era of Cinema.” We are moving beyond flat screens into fully immersive storytelling. These producers are inventing the completely new grammatical rules of VR cinema, figuring out how to direct a viewer’s attention when they can look in any direction. This is a visionary career for students who love filmmaking, virtual reality, and cutting-edge media production.

What to do after 12th?

Pursue a **B.Des in Digital Media, Film Production, or 3D Animation**. Experience with game engines (Unity/Unreal) and traditional cinematography is crucial.



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
